Serves as Assistant Chief of Staff for Logistics (ACSLOG) of the U.S. Army Regional Health Command-Atlantic about the size of a large regional health care systems with 14 hospitals and large clinics within their system; which spans 26 states and includes 14 Medical Treatment Facilities (MTFs), 1 Warrior Transition Brigade, 2 Troop Commands, Dental Health Command-Atlantic and Public Health Command-Atlantic with a \$1.6B annual budget. Responsible for the development, implementation and management of logistics policies and oversight including all aspects of the medical logistics supply chain, healthcare technology management, environmental services, logistics readiness, property management, transportation and facilities management. Logistically supports healthcare delivery to over 560K enrolled beneficiaries, over 2K Soldiers-in-Transition and management of over 1M eligible beneficiaries. Oversees management of the command's 10.9M square feet of facilities' sustainment, renovation and modernization (SRM) program, Major Repair and Renewal (MRR) program and related real property valued in excess of \$3.9B. Areas of emphasis include effective use of supply chain performance metrics and communication to ensure optimal healthcare readiness, safety, access and costs while transitioning the command to the Defense Health Agency (DHA).

Regional Health Command-Atlantic is the largest region within the U.S. Army Medical Command with 12 primary military treatment facilities east of the Mississippi River from New York state to Georgia.
