



CMRP Recertification Policy Change – Frequently Asked Questions (FAQs)

The AHA Certification Center and AHRMM are revising the CMRP recertification policy regarding continuing education credits (CECs). This change reflects AHRMM's commitment to ensuring that CMRP credential holders receive high quality and relevant educational content to support their ongoing professional development and demonstration of continued competence in the health care supply chain field.

What will change?

Certificants will be required to earn 15 of the required 45 CECs from AHRMM-sponsored education to qualify for recertification.

When will the new recertification policy going into effect?

The new policy will be going into effect in 2025.

How will the new policy be implemented?

We are implementing a phased approach based on your recertification date:

- If you are due to recertify in 2025, you are exempt from this change and may follow the current requirements. The new policy will go into effect on your next 3-year recertification cycle.
- If you are due to recertify in 2026, you will need to report a minimum of 7.5 CECs from AHRMM sponsored education. The full 15 CEC requirement will go into effect on your next 3-year recertification cycle.
- If you are due to recertify in 2027, you will need to report a minimum of 15 CECs from AHRMM sponsored education when you recertify.

What will remain the same?

- Total number of CECs – There are no changes to the minimum number of CECs required. Certificants must complete a minimum of 45 CECs in order to recertify.
- Certification period – the certification period remains at 3 years.
- Fees – No changes to the fees when you recertify.
- Recertification method – Certificants will continue to have the option of recertification by obtaining CECs or by successfully passing the CMRP exam.
- CE Qualifying Activities – There are no changes to the criteria for qualifying CE activities.
